



Vine interns were selected to participate in the Kentucky Equine Management Internship (KEMI) program for the Fall 2022 session.

The Fall 2022 session began with the traditional Orientation Week - a week of touring several Central Kentucky Thoroughbred farms, veterinary clinics, rehabilitation and retirement centers, and racetracks - intended to bring all the interns up-to-date on the vast Thoroughbred industry in the Central Kentucky area. During Orientation Week, the interns were the guests of the Kentucky Thoroughbred Association/ Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners & Breeders, Lane's End Oak Tree Division, Old Friends Retirement Farm, Hagyard Equine Medical Institute, Kentucky Equine Research, Kentucky Equine Sports Medicine & Rehabilitation Center, Hallway Feeds, Keeneland Racecourse, WinStar Farm, Rood & Riddle Equine Hospital, Churchill Downs, and the Kentucky Derby Museum.

For 24 weeks, these interns will be working on our area farms preparing yearlings and then broodmares and weanlings for the Thoroughbred auctions this fall. Their daily routine consists of caring for these horses: cleaning stalls, feeding, grooming, etc. On a few of the host farms, interns are also involved in starting young horses under saddle. In addition to this daily work on the farms and field trips, the interns attend lectures each week that focus on topics of interest to the equine industry and to Thoroughbred racing. These weekly lectures are presented by leading equine professional and provide numerous opportunities for the KEMI interns to network and refine their career goals.

Host farms for the Fall 2022 interns are: Castleton Lyons Farm, Crestwood Farm, Denali Stud,

Juddmonte Farms, Lane's End Farm, Lane's End Oak Tree Division, Mallory Farm, Shawhan Place, and Trackside Farm.

KEMI offers two internship sessions each year. The 22-week Spring session (January-June) provides opportunities for interns to work with and learn about mares, foals and reproduction. Lectures during the Spring session focus on reproduction, foal care and the nutritional needs of breeding stock and young growing horses. The 24-week Fall session (June-December) allows interns to work with sales yearlings, mares and weanlings. Lecture topics for the Fall session concentrate on sales preparation and early race training. To date, KEMI has provided internship opportunities to nearly 1,000 interns from all 50 states and 21 foreign countries. Many of the KEMI graduates are now employed in the equine industry in Kentucky and throughout the world. They have found these positions through the contacts they made while enrolled in the KEMI program.


are five \$1,000 scholarships that will be awarded to KEMI interns from Colorado State University in Holli's memory. Two of the scholarships have been awarded.
