Gight new students and one returning intern joined the Fall 2023 Kentucky Equine Management Internship (KEMI) session in Lexington, Kentucky, for five months of academic training and practical experience with Thoroughbreds. For the next 24 weeks, these students will participate in the exciting but demanding tasks of readying Thoroughbred yearlings for a variety of public sales and starting some under saddle in preparation for racing careers.

The interns enjoyed a traditional Orientation Week to begin their session, visiting farms, clinics, rehab facilities and racetracks. Orientation Week provides an eye-opening introduction to the breadth and depth of the Thoroughbred industry in Central Kentucky and the role it plays worldwide. On Monday, Shawnee Farm General Manager Randy Gilbert welcomed the interns to Kentucky and the KEMI program. Interns were briefed on general horse farm etiquette and given a safety demonstration on working with yearling Thoroughbreds. Farm visits included Godolphin's Gainsborough Farm, Lane's End Oak Tree division, Margaux Farm and WinStar Farm, and the group received extensive tours of both Rood & Riddle Equine and Hagyard Equine Medical veterinary clinics. Other highlights of the week included tours of Hallway Feeds, the Keeneland sales grounds and racetrack, Fasig-Tipton and Old Friends Retirement Farm. On Orientation Tuesday, the KEMI interns volunteered at the Kentucky Thoroughbred Farm Managers' Club's annual golf scramble, and the week closed on Friday with a fun afternoon of live racing at Belterra Park.

The interns are employed on our area farms where they work primarily with yearlings and young stock. In addition to routine barn chores, typical fall sales prep activities involve intensive daily hand-walking and grooming, showing yearlings on the farm for photos, video or prospective buyers and accompanying yearlings to the sales grounds. Interns on farms starting young horses under saddle may assist in basic groundwork or riding tasks. In addition to daily work on the farm, interns attend lectures each week that focus on topics of interest to the equine industry and Thoroughbred racing. These weekly lectures are presented by leading equine professionals and provide numerous opportunities

for KEMI interns to network and refine their career goals. The interns attended the joint Consignors and Commercial Breeders Association—Grayson-Jockey Club "Sesamoiditis and Stifle Study Panel" at Fasig-Tipton prior to the kick-off of the 2023 yearling sales season in Kentucky, and will attend the regular monthly Farm Managers' Club meetings featuring timely and topical guest speakers.

Host farms for the Fall 2023 interns are: Crestwood Farm, Denali Stud, Gainesway, Juddmonte, Mallory Farm, Pin Oak Stud, Shawhan Place, Shawnee Farm, Trackside Farm and WinStar Farm.

KEMI offers two internship sessions each year. The 22-week Spring session (January-June) provides opportunities for interns to work with and learn about mares, foals and reproduction. Lectures during the Spring session focus on reproduction, foal care and the nutritional needs of breeding stock and young growing horses. The 24-week Fall session (June-December) allows interns to work with sales yearlings, mares and weanlings. Lecture topics for the Fall session concentrate on sales preparation and early race training. To date, KEMI has provided internship opportunities to over 1,000 interns from all 50 states and 19 foreign countries. Many KEMI graduates are now employed in the equine industry in Kentucky and around the world. These professional horsemen and women found these positions and furthered their careers through contacts made while enrolled in the KEMI program.
