

APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

Thank you for your interest in the Kentucky Equine Management Internship (KEMI) program! Below are some helpful instructions for completing the application form:

All applications must include:

- 1. \$35 application fee (check or money order only—no cash accepted)
- 2. <u>ORIGINAL OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS</u> (not a copy) from ALL colleges or universities that awarded credit, even if the applicant did not receive a degree or diploma. This includes transcripts of any college course that may have been taken while the applicant was still in high school or credits that were transferred to the current/last college attended.— TRANSCRIPTS CAN BE SENT DIRECTLY FROM THE COLLEGE TO THE KEMI OFFICE BY EMAIL (info@kemi.org)
- 3. A minimum of three letters of recommendation. Guidelines for letters of recommendation:
 - Letters must be written on letterhead and/or have the appropriate contact information listed (author's name, company or business, mailing address, phone number and email address) and MUST BE SIGNED.
 - o Letters should be specifically written for the applicant for this internship.
 - o Letters of Recommendation can be directly emailed to the KEMI office (info@kemi.org)
 - Letters must include the author's credentials (why they are an appropriate person to submit a letter on the applicant's behalf) and the author's relationship to the applicant (letters from any family member, close personal friend or peer are not acceptable).
 - Letters should address the applicant's suitability for the internship including any academic achievement, horse-handling experience and personal character.
 - References may receive a survey form by mail or email to be completed and returned to the KEMI office or they may receive a phone call from the KEMI office to verify the recommendation. Please make sure your references are aware of this.

Applications will be scanned into our system; therefore the application form and supporting documentation must be printed ONLY on ONE side of the paper. Please do not staple the pages together or submit the application in any binder or folder. Paper clips are acceptable to attach the supporting documentation to the application form. If you wish to submit photographs to detail your equine experience, they should be printed on separate pages. Please do not send individual photographs as these cannot be returned. Applications that are missing any of the information or supporting documentation required are considered to be incomplete and will not be processed or returned.

All applicants will receive an email once the application has arrived and been processed. Please do not call to find out if your application was received. If you wish to have verification of delivery, please use the Postal Service Return Receipt Request Form.

Please send the application by regular mail. There is no need to send by Express or Priority mail. We accept applications (based on postmark) during the following times ONLY:

- Spring Applications August 1 through October 31 in the year prior to the internship session
- Fall Applications February 1 through April 30 in the year of the internship session

- 1. **OFFICIAL** Transcripts from all colleges and universities attended even if a degree was not awarded.
- 2. At least three original, formal letters of recommendation typed or computer generated on letterhead, from persons unrelated to you that are familiar with your academic, employment and horse experience. All reference letters must contain sender's contact information (signature, mailing address, phone number, email address) and must be signed. Letters from any relatives or peers are not acceptable. (see additional notes on page one)
- 3. \$35 non-refundable application fee (Check or Money Order only—no cash accepted).
